Motions:

- Julie 1st, Kim 2nd, all in favor to replace the cans with a dumpster at the clubhouse for the winter. We have found there is too much overflow of garbage with the cans. The cans will return in the spring when the clubhouse is not rented as much.
- Joe 1st, Scott 2nd, all in favor to raise the price of the December Prime Rib dinner to \$18 per person. The cost of food has increased greatly, and we need to cover our costs. This is still the best bargain around.

MARBAHN EGG CLEANER, Bannon Lane, Penngrove

Eggs were an important cog in the economy of Penngrove, Cotati, and Sonoma County. The eggs did not just appear in the market place. The eggs had to be gathered, and, at times, appropriated from a mean and protective hen. As one reached under the hen to remove the eggs from the nest, the hen would express her resentment by giving a few unpleasant pecks. The eggs were then placed to a specially designed basket for transportation to the Egg Packing Shed, on the farm, for further processing.

At the Shed, the eggs were cleaned of the accumulated farm waste or residue. There were at least two ways to remove the detritus. The eggs could be washed in a specially designed egg washer cleaner. The other method included brushing or buffing the waste by hand or mechanically.

After the eggs were cleaned, they were sent through a process called Candling, to check for meat spots. The eggs were then packed for shipping to the market place. The consumer could possibly receive their farm fresh eggs in a day or two after the hen laid her eggs.

Many local egg farmers used the Marbahn Egg Cleaner, a product that was marketed by two local Bannon Lane residents, John and Olga Bahnsen and Andy and Marie Markusen. Penngrove's Marbahn Egg Cleaner came in many sizes including 3 horsepower -3- phase electric motors.

Before becoming a poultry farmer, John Bahnsen, a native of Germany, partnered with local barber Herb Newbegin; the two operated a barber shop on Main Street next to Vic Mathew's bar (Vic's Place) and Joe Terribilini's Radio and Television shop.
