Penngrove's Park




In 1951, a group of civic-minded Penngrove residents formed the "The Penngrove Social Firemen", a non-profit corporation and registered as such with the State of California and the County of Sonoma. Immediately upon receipt of the papers of incorporation, the group made a memorandum with Phil Andersen for a four-acre site of what was to become "The Penngrove Park".

The first board of directors included John Kelly, Frank Hedin, Ralph Burke, Chester Donavan and Clyde Watts. The group met and created a charter, bylaws and elected the Social Firemen's first officers including John Kelly, president; Ralph Burke, vice president; Clyde Watts, secretary; and Frank Hedin, treasurer.

Funding for this project was by the Social Firemen and the Penngrove community. There was a large sign erected on the vacant lot next to Vic's Place (now the Penngrove Pub). The sign measured the results of the park fundraiser and was shaped like a thermometer, the more money raised the higher the mercury rose!

This year, The Penngrove Social Firemen celebrate their 48th year!



<p>We met with David from Quality Printing regarding his interest in partnering with PSF for a car show. David is a member with the Salvation Army, local Petaluma, Penngrove, Cotati. He has hosted several Car Shows for them in past years. The organization supports back-to-school programs for kids. He had met with the directors in the fall of 2018 to discuss the two organizations coming together. PSF would assist with the food/bar, and the Salvation Army would organize the vehicles, advertisement, set up, and clean up. PSF would receive a percentage of the proceeds. However, the only date available for the park was in August. David wished to have the event in July, prior to Hot August Nights in order to reach the maximum car buffs. Discussion:

Lengthy discussion about the progress made during workday at the park, on Saturday May 4th. Picnic area: 10 table bases were set, top boards installed. Bar: replacement of benches and painted. Top of bar sanded and finished. New boards for serving top installed and painted in kitchen area. Power washed everything. Stained perimeter of large playground. Gazebo: re-painted boards/rails, repaired electrical, and repaired joist underneath. The inside of the kitchen was cleaned out. The leak in the bar area is still present. Bob and Scott will return to inspect the cause. Several inches of soil were shoveled out and away from the kitchen area. Many old tables broken down. Garden area cleaned up for future planting. Much was accomplished. Thank you to our volunteers!

Bev Palm was present to review contracts. We will add a line for all renters advising them of parking area when renting park. Any vehicles not parked in these areas and are parked outside affecting parking spaces belonging to other merchants will be towed away at their expense.

Julie will contact the garbage company regarding the cost to change dumpsters to cans at the clubhouse. We are currently paying \$473.00 per month. Cans should be half the cost, saving us close to \$3,000.00 per year. The biggest problem is the weight of the garbage trucks coming onto the driveway has cause much damage. We will be repaving very soon. Cans will be moved onto street on pick-up day, eliminating trucks on the driveway.

Kim handed out an overview of our income and expenses for 2018. All directors will review these and discuss at the next meeting.
