Think about taking a chairperson position on a committee or event. We are an aging group and it would be nice to know that we have younger people to take over with in the next decade.

Directors Meeting July 11, 2016

Present were President Ray Soper, Directors Roland Mellor, Julie Hanson, Nick Bursio, Scott Finley, Don Barella Joe Turner Joe Pedrani and guest Bill Fishman. We spoke of the issues that Penngrove Social Firemen have with Martin Sessi's rebuilding of the market & the considerable changes. One of them is the drainage and what will become of the water that runs down from the store and the property as it is proposed to be a considerable slope. We already have flooding issues in the park in the winter. Another is the right of way/easement and how it will affect the Penngrove Park with large trucks parking to unload and possibly blocking the park entrance. Also it is proposed in the new plans to have a curbing that comes out into the driveway between store & park. The curb considerably cuts off the driveway. The solutions we have noted would be: Handicap parking on the street, making store patio smaller and trucks backing into the annex area to unload. Penngrove Social Firemen need to have access to the parks back entrance for safety and emergency vehicle use. Water runoff is an issue, due to flooding, and current easement also is an issue as the store/patio/parking will cut into the easement. We are looking for a solution that makes everyone happy. The Penngrove Social Firemen Board of Directors will meet at the park entrance on Thursday, July 14th at 4pm with a rep from the Sonoma County Building Dept, David Rabbitt & Martin Sessi. The work for the 2017 Penngrove Parade & Celebration needs to start in the fall, to work with Smart Train to see if issues can be worked out. It is possible to have to pay a large amount for permits once the train is in operation. The cleanup at the Park after the celebration event was to be done by Penngrove 4H members. The job was not finished, and since we do not have member participation, it is being proposed for July 2017 to hire 3 people to do this. We already have someone in mind. Also because some of the ones that work the

bar for this event are getting older, we thinking of hire 3 bartenders next year. And at the ticket booth, 2 people didn't show up for a work shift at ticket booth. We are discussing raising the dues starting in January 2017 to help defray the cost of hiring people to do the work that club members don't want to sign up for. When you pay your annual dues you are agreeing to donate 8 hours a year of volunteer time. That is not happening with lots of our members. The older senior members aren't expected to do this, but even 92 year old Joe Turner was helping around the food area most of the day. The younger people in this club should be ashamed that they are not pitching in and doing their part. The Directors support the dues increase if that is what needs to be done. Rents of the clubhouse & park take care of approximately 45% of the overhead for both sites and 55% are covered through dues, raffles, dinners and fundraisers. Don Barella & Scott Finley will check with Bobby Ghilotti to see if he can assist with some equipment to take the park terrain down a few inches and level it out. Then we would throw some lawn seed out. There is no revenue from the ball park as it is provided for the community. July 17th irrigation water is to be shut off in preparation of the car show on July 23rd. Scott will put the speed bumps back in place around July 26th. Bev Paul will replace Tobie on bookings at the park and clubhouse.

On The Way

Paul Azevedo has donated a 40" container for the park. The container will be used for storage of baseball equipment for teams using the ball diamond and for storage mobile equipment re: lawn mowers, larger landscape equipment and misc. park maintenance equipment.




