

### Penngrove Social Firemen Directors Meeting November 7, 2011

President Reiter opened the meeting at 7:00 pm.

Those present were: Ray Soper, Patty Soper, Al Davidson, Pam Rossi, John Rossi, Don Barella, Bill Park, Roland Mellor, Joel Reiter, Speed Messenberg, Joe Turner & Kim Hanson.

Park Ranger Al Davidson said that the Park is practically shut down for the winter.

Speed Messenberg said old worn out light sockets above benches in main hall of the Clubhouse have been replaced with new ones. New wiring is hanging from ceiling ready to tie into the sockets. Plugs installed in ceiling are for Christmas white strings of small lights. Furnace was wired to dedicated circuit,

Ray Soper reported there is \$22,379.61 in checking and \$39,275.72 in savings for a total of \$61,655.33. Ray Soper stated interest is very low on accounts in First Community Bank. Directors discussed researching alternatives

The last meeting of the year, December 7, 2011 will be voting and will take place at the meeting. Don Barella and Kim Hanson have volunteered to work the polling booth and also to check each person to make sure he/she is a member before receiving a ballot. Ray Soper will furnish Don & Kim with an updated active member list. Don Barella, Kim Hanson & Roland Mellor were appointed to count the ballots also.

It was moved, seconded and passed to waive the cleaning fee (\$125.00) for the Santa Rosa Lions Club (Montgomery Village) for their fund raiser they are having in January 2012. They will clean up the hall themselves.

It was moved, seconded and passed for the Person nominated for the "Gold Key". This award is for members or non-members that give their time and energy to the Social Firemen for work needed to be done.

It was moved, seconded and passed for the Person nominated for the "Silver Spoon". This award is for continued help by this person in the clubhouse kitchen. It was moved, seconded and passed for the Person selected by the President to be awarded the "President's Award". This person must have done things above and beyond the expectations of the President.

It was discussed: moved, seconded and passed to allow Patty Soper look into refinancing our present loan with Wells Fargo for a better rate..

There was much conversation on the July 28, 2012 Penngrove Graffiti Car show of which John Rossi is the chairperson. Talked about T-shirts and other items. More information in the Gazette at a later date.

Patty Soper stated she talked to the Principal at Penngrove School on their needs, Patty asked for the name of two needy family's (children's ages and sizes). Social Firemen are willing to help in making this holiday season for kids.

Directors talked about rug in the Fireside room. It's costing the Social Firemen with the rug cleaning and we're leaning toward getting rid of the rug and installing tile or hardwood to match large hall floors. Nothing settled and will be discussed at a later date.

It was moved, seconded and passed to purchase camera for Bill Park to use, to show damage by renters using the Clubhouse.

Talked about sanding and refinishing the main hall floor because of the marks that the dance people are leaving on the hardwood with the Klogger type dance. Talked about using some type of wood covering over the hardwood for the dancers to use. Nothing figured out at this time. Research will continue.

Moved, seconded and passed to pay the Park Ranger's phone bill (monthly) because it is used for Park rental business. Al Davidson has been paying himself. The Directors decided to pay Al Davidson \$500.00 for his past payments to the phone company for 35 months.

It was discussed that we need more/better lighting at the Park for evening rental events and the Social Firemen events. We probably will rent some lighting.

President Reiter stated that he wants full accounting of all funds as December 31, 2011 when he leaves as President of the Social Firemen.

Kim Hanson wanted to know if more people will be involved in our Christmas Dinner in December. Ray said we are all involved. Family style dinner is the best way.

Meeting adjourned at 8:45 pm.



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
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
