### **Looking back - The Ranch by Jack Withington**

On September 15, 1944, my parents, Norman and Edith Withington, bought a 10-acre chicken ranch from Ing Hon Low and May Guen Yuen. The property had been part of the 'Maass Ranch" and, according to the deed the ranch was about three-quarters of a mile north of Penngrove. The adjacent property to the northeast of the Withington Ranch was the former site of Penngrove's Methodist Church, built in 1898.

In Ellen Harris' "Penngrove Past & Present", (copies available at the JavAmore Coffee shop at 10101 Main Street) the book states that in 1910 the attendance of the church had dwindled so it was then moved into town. Workman placed the church on rollers and rolled the building down the Hill Road and up Adobe Road to the present location on Oak Street. Besides a new home, the church switched denominations going from Methodist-Episcopal to Congregational Church, and later becoming the United Church of Christ.

What is now called Formschlag Lane, and at one time known as Wedemeyer Lane, ran east and west along the Withington/ Methodist Church property line. The Formschlag family were early Penngrove pioneers. According to Penngrove historian and author John Sheehy, when Peter Formschlag died in 1883, and his widow married Fred Wedemeyer--hence the name Wedemeyer Lane, which today is called Formschlag Lane.

*Looking Back – The Ranch, continued...*

Another Penngrove pioneer named David Wharff owned much of the property along Wedemeyer/Formschlag Lanes. He is credited as the man who brought laying hens into the area.

The Withington family could not take possession of the property until the end of World War Two. They were committed to honor a lease for a five-acre chicken ranch owned by the Yamasaki family on Skillman Lane. The Yamasaki's were interned due to Executive Order 9066. That lease would end when the legal owners, the Yamasaki family, were able to reclaim their property. The Agreement of Lease was drawn by the Petaluma attorney firm of Lounibos & Lounibos and was dated April 14, 1942.

After the war, the Withington family finally took possession of the ranch. It was decided that they would raise meat birds rather than laying hens. Along with the meat birds, the farm included a 13-can Grade B milk contract with the Petaluma Cooperative Creamery. Grade B milk was used for manufacturing cream, butter, and nonfat dry milk. Grade A milk, also called fluid grade milk, refers to milk used for fluid consumption.
